The HIVE is situated in the Roundhouse and our opening hours are on the following page. Please feel free to pop in and see us, leave us a message on our answer phone or send us an E-mail and we will get back to you.

The HIVE is an information centre for the Service Community, which includes single and married serving personnel, civilian MOD employees and their dependents.

Our aim is to provide a professional information and referral service. We endeavour to answer all your queries and find the information you need, or point you in the right direction for the best possible help and support. We can offer you a welcome pack with maps and information leaflets to get you started in your new posting.

If you are arriving from outside Germany you should have received a copy of "So You Are Posted to Germany", which gives you information on everything you need to know on arrival, e.g. documentation, pay, registering your vehicle, claiming Job Seekers Allowance etc. You should also have received a copy of the Hohne Service Community Official Guide, which gives more detailed information about the local community including housing, schools, welfare support and station facilities. Copies of both these booklets are available from The HIVE.

A – Z OF USEFUL INFORMATION

The following information is aimed at providing a general guide, which we hope will make settling into Hohne a little easier. More detailed

information on many of these subjects can be found in the Hohne Service Community Guide, or by contacting the HIVE team. The Heide Magazine also holds information and contact numbers available from the HIVE or the NAAFI. The Heide mag is available once a month free of charge. It is produced by the Heide team with contributions from the Garrison.

ACCOMMODATION

If you have family visiting from the UK and need details on accommodation, call into the HIVE for a comprehensive list of local B&BS and Hotels.

BANKS

There are two branches of local German banks in Bergen, the Sparkasse and the Volksbank, these are situated on the main street and have English speaking staff. A branch of Santander (formerly Abbey National) is situated in the Forces Financial Offices in the Roundhouse.

BFG THE CAR

You are required under British Army (Germany) Standing order 3213 to register your vehicle with the BFG Vehicle Licensing Office. The unit BFG Registration Office, (depending on your unit) will advise you on the correct procedure to be followed. All members of BFG must register their vehicles with the BFG VLO within 30 days of arrival. Before registration all drivers must take a matrix test and be issued with a BFG Driving Permit. Forces Finance provides BFG insurance. Their UK insurance company can provide BFG Green Card for BFG license office. A list of BFG recognised insurers is available from the BFG office or the HIVE.

“The Heide“is a free monthly station magazine full of useful information. You can collect your copy from the HIVE each month.

CHURCHES

Holy Family RC Church and St George’s Garrison Church are both located on camp. Information and timings can be found in The Heide or the HIVE.

CLUBS

There is a clubs page within The Heide mag (the local magazine available from the HIVE or the NAAFI with contact numbers.

CINEMAS

There is a cinema on camp called the Red Rat. Cinema listings can be found in the Heide Magazine (From the HIVE). The HIVE holds details of cinema listings and transport details.

COINS

The HIVE collects all your unused foreign currency for charity.

CONCERTS

Every month The Heide magazine advertises up and coming concert information sourced by the HIVE, we do not sell the tickets. We also hold a number of web sites and ticket hotline numbers. These can also be found on the Hohne's local pages on www.hive-europe.co.uk

DOCUMENTS

While in Germany, you should make sure that you carry your documents at all times, whether it's your ID Card, NAAFI Shopping Permit, or your car documents while driving.

EMPLOYMENT

GLSU (General Labour Support Unit) is located in MB50, the HCSO's block.

FISHING

There are a number of lake's in the area and an Angling Club in Hohne, please call into the HIVE for information.

FURTHER EDUCATION/LEISURE CLASSES

42 AEC provides language, IT, Basic Skills and leisure courses. The ALC & Learn Direct Suite in 3 RHA also provide computer based courses. VTS also provide many courses including NVQs.

GERMAN LAW

German Law is largely the same as the UK; however, there are a few that may catch you out. The booklet "So you are Posted to Germany" is very helpful in understanding them, available from the HIVE.

GERMAN BENEFITS

The claiming of Kindergeld and other German benefits is an individual's responsibility and is strictly between the individual and the German authorities. Kindergeld Application forms and guidelines are available from the Regimental Admin Offices or from the HCSO's Liaison Clerk in the same office as the HIVE.

GOLF

There are a number of Golf courses in the Area and also a Garrison Golf Club, please call into the HIVE for more Information.

HIVE DATABASE

The HIVE's computer database is an A-Z of useful local information, services, clubs, businesses, telephone numbers etc. The database is updated regularly and if you would like something to be included please contact a member of the HIVE team.

HOUSING

For information on housing refer to the Hohne Service Community Official Guide. The housing clerks can be contacted on 962 2420. The HIVE also holds information on renting or buying houses.

ID CARDS/NAAFI SHOPPING PERMITS

All military personnel, entitled civilians and dependants are required to carry an ID card. A NAAFI Shopping Permit is issued to all entitled personnel and will be required to use the NAAFI shopping facilities. Shopping Permits are available from the Regimental Welfare Offices.

INTERNET

You can access the internet in most Unit Welfare Offices, in the Learn Direct Suites (one in 42 AEC and the other in 3 RHA) or at BAAN 41 outside camp. There is also an internet cafe in the roundhouse.

LEAFLETS

The HIVE holds leaflets containing a huge variety of information on everything from benefits to bus timetables. We hold core information on a variety of subjects including education, social security, health, housing, communications etc. We also have dozens of pamphlets on local attractions and places of interest, as well as things to do further afield. We have produced comprehensive booklets giving you ideas for day trips either with or without children in mind. If you're stuck for ideas on what to do or where to go, then just pop in to see us.

LEGAL HELP AND INFORMATION

We hold the telephone numbers for Army Legal Aid and the dates of when they are in Bielefeld.

LEISURE ACTIVITIES

The HIVE has two booklets which list some of the most popular leisure activities; these are Summer Activities and Winter Warmers. We also hold a wide range of leaflets with something to suit all.

MAPS

We can print street maps and routes for you.

MONEY MATTERS

There is a choice of Banks in Bergen and Celle and most of them speak English. Many flats in Bergen are visited by sales personnel. The HCSO's Liaison Clerk will gladly give a verbal translation of contracts before you sign.

MOBILE PHONE

Mobile phone contracts in Germany are usually for 24 months with 3 months notice of cancellation. There are several mobile phone shops in the area.

NIGHT CLUBS

There aren't any night clubs in Bergen but there are two bars with music and dancing until late. There are night clubs in Celle, Hannover and Hamburg.

OPENING TIMES

A comprehensive list of opening times and telephone numbers for facilities, shops and clubs is available from the HIVE.

PETROL COUPONS

Duty Free Fuel Coupons cannot be sold to you unless you have a Vehicle Registration Card with an up to date and valid light/roadworthiness stamp on it. Petrol coupons, which are rationed, are available from the Mehrwertsteuer office which is in the old Sparkasse Bank opposite the roundhouse.

PETS

When you arrive in BFG you must register all your pets at the Housing Office MB50. All dogs must wear a collar disc bearing the owner's address. Failure to do so could result in a large fine. The HIVE holds a list of local vets and kennels. We also hold the information you require to get a pet passport allowing you to take your pet back to the UK.

PLACES TO VISIT

In the HIVE we hold lots of leaflets and information for places to visit in the local area and a number of city guides for nights or weekends away.

POSTINGS

The HIVE can obtain Garrison Guides and HIVE 'Welcome' packs from other stations. We also have a comprehensive 'Get You Back Pack'.

QUESTIONS

The HIVE will endeavor to answer all your questions. You will not leave the HIVE empty handed. We will either refer you to another agency, give you the details you want, a phone number or a promise that we will get back to you, if we do not have the information you require.

RESTAURANTS

There is a wide choice of restaurants in the area; we have produced an Eat Drink and Be Merry booklet at the HIVE. Please call in for a copy.

SCHOOLS

Schools are administered by Service Children's Education (SCE). SCE is a defence agency whose headquarters are located at Wegberg, BFPO 40. There are two primary schools, Montgomery (on camp) and Slim (in Bergen town) and one secondary, Gloucester (outside camp) all of these have links on the HIVE website.

SHOPPING (TAX FREE)

Bergen is only a small village with a few shops however we are close to a number of big cities. We have a booklet called "Shop till you drop" and that has full details on shopping in the area and Tax Free Shopping.

SWIMMING

The Garrison has one outdoor full sized swimming pool, this is free of charge and timings are available in the Heide Mag. Local swimming pools are situated in Bergen and Celle. For prices and opening times call the HIVE

TAXI

There are several taxi firms around. There is a taxi rank on camp by the Dental Centre and one in the centre of town.

TELEVISION

BFBS is the forces television service. Television listing can be found in the Sixth Sense. Also available in the Garrison is cable and Digital Satellite TV.

TRANSLATOR

The HCSO's Translation Clerk is based within the HIVE and is happy to give verbal

translations of your letters and forms. She also deals with German benefit forms, Telephone connections and disconnections.

TRANSPORT / Travel (LOCAL)

Information on local bus services is available from the HIVE.

Travel/Holiday information is available from Forces finance in the Roundhouse and O'Girkes in the welfare buildings.

UNEMPLOYMENT BENEFIT

All newly arrived dependants who wish to claim unemployment benefits should register with the local German Employment Office (Arbeitsamt) **no later than seven days after their arrival in Germany or they may lose their benefit.**

The office can be found at Hermannsburg (Celler Strasse 57, 29320 Hermannsburg, Tel: 05052 989112 or 989113).

The HIVE also holds a number of leaflets on general DSS information.

VISITORS

When families are visiting you in Germany you should obtain a Close Relatives Form from your Unit Welfare Office. The form entitles close relatives to shop, (on behalf of you) for non-rationed items in the NAAFI, and to minor medical treatment in the medical centre.

The HIVE is indebted to our volunteers, who give up their time to enable us to provide the best possible service to our customers. If you are able to spare a few hours a week to help in our busy HIVE, our team would be glad to welcome you.
